12. General Data Protection Act

The Clerk informed members that Data protection law will significantly change on May 25th 2018 when the EU Directive known as General Protection Regulation GDPR take effect and all councillors need to be aware that this law is changing. This will effectively replace the 1998 Act. The GDPR will be directly applicable in the UK without the need to implement national legislation. As with the 1998 local authorities will be subject to the GDPR. Many of the GDPR'S principles are the same as those in the 1998 Act. However GDPR imposes new obligations on data controllers and data processors and provides enhances rights for individuals.

The Council is the Data Controller and the Data Protection Officer cannot be the clerk or a councillor and arrangements need to be in place for the date.
